

Limbo is in, are you?

Tacoma, Wash - [New Empire Productions](#) is proud to announce that their comedy, [LIMBO](#), has been accepted to the [2008 Seattle True Independent Film Festival \(STIFF\)](#) as the only film from Tacoma to make it into the festival this year! The film will be screened on June 15th at 9:30 pm at the [Central Cinema](#) in Seattle, Wa.

The film follows, Joe, a lovable loser and thirtysomething, who has lost his business, his girl and his way. Luckily for Joe, he has friends who will do anything, and we mean anything, to help him get back on track in life and out of limbo.

"It's a story that a lot of people can relate to" says Joe Rosati, who plays a skewed version of himself in the film. "It's a comedy of irony and errors, so to speak, when you have your friends trying to help you but can't even help themselves," says Michael Winfrey, who wrote the script and acted in the film.

LIMBO has been a massive community effort that began at Pierce College in Lakewood and has grown into a movement. It features the city of Tacoma's best and brightest in the art and business community, as well as some breath taking shots of the city. Actors, musicians, business', restaurants and families pitched in to create the film by lending their talents, time and locations to make the film possible.

The first screening was at Jazzbones, a restaurant and nightclub that was packed with people for two nights. It was screened again several times around Tacoma including the Galaxy 6 theatres which replaced Disney's Pirates of the Caribbean 3 for one evening, a first for any independent film in the city.

The month of October 2007 was another win for LIMBO as the Tacoma Film Festival accepted and premiered the film. The film is currently available on Click Cable Networks via On Demand in the Tacoma area through this year. While a DVD is in the works, including extra features and a few surprises, it is gaining more regional attention by being accepted to the 2008 STIFF festival, bringing with it new attention and accolades.

Later this year, a few more films are expected from New Empire Productions' new film division, [133 Films](#). The first, a suspense filled short, entitled [Sarah Jane Road](#). The trailer for SJR has done well in festivals, being a finalist in the Boomtown Film and Music Festival in Beaumont, Texas. Later this year will bring other projects we are extremely excited to unveil.
